These are the words of tears and relief Tuesday surrounding the tragic collision of the two U. S. Navy destroyers off Newport Beach.

"IT WAS just like you'd kick in a big can," one of the first rescue workers on the scene of the destroyer smash-up said.

"It was so foggy we

couldn't see more than one-eighth of a mile," Stan Annin, Newport Harbor Department deputy, said.

"The wreckage on the Ammen deck was terrific. "All of the cabin was caved in. The anchor from the Collett was still imbedded in the cabin.

"It (cabin) was just like you'd crush a beer can."

"THE CREW was standing on the deck in lifejackets and everybody looked calm," said another rescuer, Barry Randall.

"Some of them were covered with paint and oil."

ONE SEAMAN described the incident as follows:

"I heard someone scream, 'Lay low!'—and then it hit. "We had just been talking about the fog and someone said if we collided with another ship, we wouldn't have a chance."

ONE NAVY officer told all survivors not to speak with newsmen.

The same officer also tried to have hospital employees maintain the same secrecy.

If the ammunition had been aboard, the collision could have triggered a major explosion aboard the ship.

THE AMMEN, her port-side smashed, listed and looked worse than when she took a Japanese Kamikaze off Okinawa during World War II, officers said.

to an approaching rescuer: "Don't light a cigarette. There's a hell of a lot of fuel down there and the whole thing could blow up."

A NEWPORT Beach life-guard boat was the first able to make contact with the ships in the thick fog. The boat brought back six injured men. One of them died en route.

ONE OF the injured told rescuers:

"It was foggy. I don't know how it happened. "It just happened."

ONE OF the other injured was so dazed that, in answer to any question, he merely repeated his name and age.

THE AMMEN's engine room was flooded by water gushing through a gaping hole.

The smoke that poured out led to the first—and erroneous reports—that it was on fire.

SIX NAVY ships and several helicopters were hampered in establishing contact with the destroyers because of the dense fog.

One of the officers said visibility at the scene at the beginning was only 200 yards.

Tug Spree May Hasten Sea Duty

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Navy Seaman Stanley S. Halvorsen II, 21, may yet get his wish for sea duty.

Last June 28 Halvorsen and a 18-year-old friend took a commercial tugboat and cruised around the Bay Area without lights for several hours before ramming a dock.

He told police then that he had joined the Navy to go to sea, but instead had been assigned to duty in the Nevada desert.

Municipal Judge Clayton W. Horn Tuesday placed Halvorsen on one-year probation and directed him to pay \$1,400 for damage to the tugboat.

The Navy indicated it was undecided whether to press more charges against the youth, considering double jeopardy statutes. But a Navy spokesman said it could transfer him to a sea command.

A MARINE CORPS helicopter, carrying two medical doctors, slammed to the deck of one of the destroyers during the rescue operation.

Miraculously, none was injured.

SWITCHBOARDS of The Independent and the Naval Station were crowded with telephone calls from relatives who had men aboard the two ships.

"I've just got to know," said one Long Beach man. "My son—my only son—is aboard one of the destroyers."

Identity of the dead was withheld immediately pending notification of the next of kin.

FROM THE air, observers described the wrecked bow of the Collett "like a can opener had ripped it open."

They said that the Ammen's deck appeared to be only five feet above water.

THE COLLETT ripped open the Ammen's paint locker above midship, sending paint and fuel squirting.

"It could have been a far worse situation if fire had broken out," another observer said.

"ONLY two weeks ago, Navy rescuers said, they completed an intensive training program for just such situations.

"Everything went just like clockwork," they said.

THE AMMEN also was lucky. Crewmen unloaded a large amount of ammunition Monday at the U. S. Navy's Ammunition and

THE FIRST radio messages between the two stricken ships following the collision were as follows:

"Do you require assistance?" asked the Collett.

"Do you require assistance?" replied the Ammen.

IN THE battle of Leyte and Okinawa in 1944, the Ammen shot down five Japanese suicide planes.

One Kamikaze flew through protective fire and smashed the Ammen amidship, killing five men.

THE FIRST words from James R. McBride of the Orange County Harbor Department, one of the first on the scene, were as follows:

"It's awful. "The ocean is covered with diesel fuel and there's a real fire hazard."

ONE OF THREE IN STATE L.B. Will Be AF Unit Center

Long Beach Air Force Base will be one of three sector headquarters for an eight-state area covered by the newly designated 6th Air Force Reserve Region, Lt. Col. H. W. Edmisten, commander of the training center here, announced Tuesday.

The reserve organization, which will have responsibility for recruiting and training personnel for survival and support of recovery in case of enemy nuclear attack, will remain here when flying units are transferred to March Air Force Base in Riverside, Col. Edmisten said.

Both the post-attack recovery role and the regional headquarters administration are part of a major reorganization of the reserve forces recently approved by Air Force Secretary Thomas Gates.

UNDER THE reorganization the three Continental Air Command numbered Air Forces, including the 4th Air Force headquartered at Hamilton Air Force Base near San Francisco, are replaced by six regional headquarters to conform with Army regional commands.

The 6th Air Force Reserve Regional headquarters was activated July 1 at Hamilton AFB. Sector headquarters will be at Long Beach, San Francisco and Vancouver, Wash.

Numerical designated active duty trainees in subordinate units, such as the 2545th Air Reserve Center here, will remain the same.

The local center will continue to administer training programs through the present Reserve Groups, squadrons and flights.
