
Grid TV Fans Get Break

Football fans may want to hug Commissioner Joe Foss of the new American League for his statement over the weekend that all televised games in his circuit would be "uncensored."

"Our league will have no restrictions whatsoever on telecasts," informed Foss, who visited the Chargers' camp in Orange Tuesday. "That means that if player dis-



Such censorship of player brawls, which occur in every football game, has incurred the wrath of NFL fans. Sportswriters have knocked the rule as hypocritical and ridiculous.

Camera crews would divert their lenses to other parts of the stadium during a scuffle-and usually this would intensify the TV fan's interest in the unseen.

"The living room fan is entitled to the full production," declared Foss. "I don't think a league has the right to hide player disturbances from view-especially when they are being seen by thousands in the stadium.

"It would be inconsistent for us to allow the paying public within a stadium to see the full production, then screen certain portions from the view of the television
